

DANSVILLE'S DAVE WOLF ELECTED TRUSTEE OF STATE VOLUNTEER
FIREMEN'S HOME

DAVID J. WOLF, FORMER CHIEF OF THE DANSVILLE FIRE DEPARTMENT, IN LIVINGSTON COUNTY, HAS BEEN ELECTED TO A FIVE YEAR TERM AS A TRUSTEE OF THE FIREMEN'S HOME FOR RETIRED VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS IN HUDSON, N.Y.
